<b>Cap and Tax</b>	Even though it did not pass Congress, forcing it through the U.S. House cost some Dems their seats in 2010.	<b>HURT:</b> The complete failure of the “green economy” and Solyndra becoming its poster child -- has harmed the green movement irreparably.
<b>Debt Ceiling</b>	S&P downgrade will be in every historical text about the Obama administration.	<b>HURT:</b> Dems with their liberal base that simply do not want to cut any government program, ever.
<b>Jobs Bill</b>	Widely viewed as DOA on Capitol Hill and in the mainstream media.	<b>HURT:</b> His “pass this bill” chants make him appear as desperate as he really is – his poll numbers dropped after his speech. Obama made big promises to teachers to shore up his political base, promises that cannot ever be made reality, meaning more disappointment for his base.
